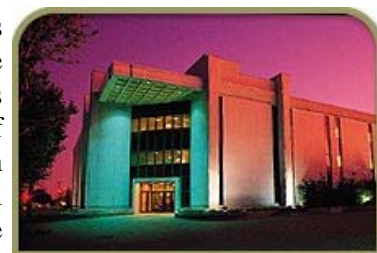

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

To better understand our classes, I am asking our instructors to give a short synopsis to be shared each month as space allows. This is what Karl Johnson prepared for two of his classes.

The *Googling for Ancestors* class will cover the basic search statements for Google and then continue with more advanced search techniques to hone in on specific material. Following that, it covers the Google goodies of book searches, U.S. Patent searches, map queries, and foreign text translations.

The *Digital Photography* class will cover the various features of both Point & Shoot cameras and Single Lens Reflex (SLR) cameras. Following that, the class will cover the photo techniques of shooting modes, metering modes, picture style, and scene observation. The class will then cover the genealogy applications of photography, such as tombstones, photographs and documents, microfilm and book copying and then followed by a short overview of digital storage and archiving as well as digital editing.
